CCE Coursework- Northwood-Kensett Juniors & Seniors who test proficient in at least one standardized measure (Iowa Assessments, ACT, Accuplacer) can choose to take NIACC college courses for dual credit. Most N-K students choose online coursework, but students who choose to travel to NIACC every day also have that option available to them as long as they are in good standing in core courses.

Career Academy- Seniors who wish to take part in a Career Academy program at NIACC may take 1/2 day training at the NIACC campus that counts for both high school credit, plus the student's first year in that college program. Programs available include: Heating & Air Conditioning (HVAC), Automotive Technician, Diesel Technology, Tool & Die, Building Trades, Welding, and Industrial Maintenance. NIACC Student Support Services (TRIO)- Students who are 1st generation college students, who are low income, or who have a physical or learning disability qualify to take part in this program, which offers counseling, tutoring, college survival skills, orientation classes, career exploration, as well as transfer assistance. Students who would like to take advantage of these services can start the process by speaking with the NIACC representative here from CareerLink to make sure that services are in place by Fall 2020.

FAFSA (Federal Student Aid) - Mary Bloomingdale, the director of NIACC's financial aid department, will be here to assist parents in filling out the FAFSA for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents and/or students can make an appointment for the representative to complete the application with them, or they can start the application and have any questions cleared up by the representative on this date. For many, this will save a lot of stress or at least a trip to Mason City! For the full application, please budget 45 minutes. For questions about an application you've already begun, 15-20 minutes. FAFSA for the 2020-2021 school year opened October 1st using 2018's tax documents. *Students do not need to attend NIACC to take advantage of this service.*
